The very first international school in Japan started in Yokohama City. It is Saint Maur International School, which was founded in 1872. Today, in the city of Yokohama with 81,000 foreign residents, there are 10 international and ethnic schools. "Art Exhibition for Children of International and Ethnic Schools" was planned so that more people would be familiar with the children with different backgrounds studying at these schools. The exhibitions, which started in 2013, having been very successful, our committee has decided to hold it again this year.

Our aim is to earn the public's respect to the meaning of international understanding and multiculturalism by showing the artworks created by the children. Furthermore, we hope the children who contributed their works will visit the library with their family, become familiar with it, and feel the library a close institution to them. On holding the exhibition at Yokohama City Central Library, which is one of the largest scale libraries in Kanagawa Prefecture, we called for pictures under the themes 'books', 'reading' and 'library'. We are happy to have collected wonderful works from these schools. I hope you enjoy the exhibition.
