As there are many roads and paths to the hills, and many shops inbetween Motomachi-Chukagai Sta. and Ishikawa-cho Sta. it will be fun for you to create a course plan on your own including shopping plan.</p>		<p>6 Yamate Residence 89-6 Like the neighboring Residence 234, it was designed for overseas visitors and has similar architectural features. The Enoki-tei Coffee Shop is on the first floor.</p>		<p>10 Yamate Catholic Church The original cathedral was built in 1862. The existence premises were rebuilt after the Great Kanto Earthquake. It is one of the signature premises in Yamate. [H]</p>	
	<p>1 Mishiri-zaka As you turn left off Motomachi shopping street, the road branches. The slope to the left is Mishiri-zaka. It goes by the Yokohama Meteorological Observatory.</p>		<p>7 Ehrismann's Residence This residence was first built elsewhere in 1926. It was the home of a Swiss trader F. Ehrismann. Items from this period are on display. [Hours: 9:30 a.m.-5 p.m. (6 p.m. Jul.-Aug.) / Closed on 4th Wed., 045-211-1101, Free, tea room available] [H]</p>		<p>11 The Home of Diplomat (Gaikokan-no-le) Inside the garden is the former residence of the Meiji era diplomat Sadatsuchi Uchida. Originally built in 1910. Furniture and decorations from this period have been re-created for public viewing. [Hours: 9:30 a.m.-5 p.m. (6 p.m. Jul.-Aug.) / Closed on 4th Wed., 045-662-8819, Free, tea room available] [National Designated Important Cultural Properties]</p>
	<p>2 Yokohama Foreign General Cemetery The cemetery was established to accommodate the American government's wish to have a cemetery with a view of the sea. More than 4,000 souls from 40 nations rest here. [Hours: 10 a.m.-5 p.m. / Closed on Mon., 045-622-1312, Free]</p>		<p>8 Berrick Hall The Spanish-style exterior is representative of J.H. Morgan, its architect. It was constructed as the residence of an English trader, B. R. Berrick. He was an Honorary Consul of Finland. Of the remaining houses for overseas visitors in the city, this is the largest. [Hours: 9:30 a.m.-5 p.m. (6 p.m. Jul.-Oct.) / Closed on 2nd Wed., 045-663-5685, Free] [H]</p>		<p>12 Yamate Italia Hill Garden The Italian Consulate was formerly located on this site from 1880 to 1886, so this area is called as Italia-yama (Italian hill). The garden in Italia-yama commands a panoramic view of MM21 and Kannai.*</p>
	<p>[Side Trip] Kaigara-zaka At the road branches to "Mishiri-zaka" (1) and "Kaigara-zaka" take the right path which runs between Motomachi Park and Yokohama Foreign General Cemetery to the "Yamate-hon-dori". The slope's name is derived from the shells (Kaigara) found in the Cemetery soil.</p>		<p>9 Motomachi Park An information board in the park commemorates this as the "home of Western roofing tiles" because tile fause A. Gerard founded a roofing tile factory here. He was aware of the water from Yamate spring, and built water reservoirs for supply to ships. These facilities were called "Mizu Yashiki" (Spring side house)</p>		<p>13 Bluff Residence 18 The Bluff Residence 18, a European-style building of the Taisho period (1912-1926), has been relocated to the garden. The residence is open to the public as a museum. [Hours: 9:30 a.m.-5 p.m. (6 p.m. Jul.-Oct.) / Closed on 2th Wed., 045-662-6319, Free] [H]</p>
	<p>3 Yamate Museum Built in 1909, this is Meiji Era Western-style wooden house in Yokohama. Artifacts of the era are on display here. [Hours: 10 a.m.-5 p.m. / Closed on Mon., 045-622-1311, Charge] [H]</p>		<p>[Side Trip] Hitai-zaka This slope leads down to the former site of the roofing tile factory and "Mizu Yashiki" (13) and then to Daikan-zaka.</p>		<p>14 Omarudani-zaka This area, already called Omarudanizaka when Yokohama was incorporated as a city, was known as the street where sailors gathered to enjoy themselves.</p>
	<p>4 Yokohama Christ Church Built in 1931 Magnificent stonework is this church's distinguishing feature. It is one of the signature premises in Yamate. [H]</p>		<p>[Side Trip] Daikan-zaka This slope was named after the residence of Tokuemom Ishikawa. He was a governor (Daikan) of Yokohama and made several contributions reception house when Perry's fleet came Japan.</p>	<p>《Annex》 [Open Hours / Closed Day, Telephone number, Admission fee (Free or Charge)] The following day if it falls on a national holiday [H]: Yokohama City Recognized Historical Structures. *There is no regular holiday either by facilities. 	<p>5 Yamate Residence 234 Built in 1927. It is the only remaining historical apartment for foreign residents in the city. promote the historical heritage in Yamate. [Hours: 9:30 a.m.-5 p.m. (6 p.m. from Jul.-Aug.) / Closed on 4th Wed., 045-625-9393 Free] [H]</p>		<p>[Side Trip] Shiokumi-zaka The area around the slope was formally called as Shiokumizaka in 1890's as residents had processed and conveyed salt through this slope. Novelist Atsushi Nakajima taught at a girl's school at the bottom of this slope.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •The walking time is calculated for about one minute by 80 meters. •The guide board that puts a map and a peripheral guide in facilities on the course is set up. (map side [H] sign) •The Minatomirai line is written as the MM line. •The honorific title is omitted. •Publishing information is the one as of April, 2005.
