Yokohama City has started creating a new medium-term plan for the FY2026 to FY2029 planning period.


We have compiled this basic direction of the new medium-term plan to present our approach and framework for creating the plan.

The future of Yokohama as envisioned by children



This is an analysis of opinions from children obtained through text mining of children's workshops and opinions collected digitally. Nouns were extracted for the analysis. Assumed words such as Yokohama were excluded, and identical words with different orthography (hiragana or katakana) were handled as the same word.

Overview of collected opinions

A range of diverse and serious requests were provided, such as for urban beautification, nature preservation, safe park facilities for playing, improved school lunches, and social measures to eliminate bullying and discrimination. The children were able to understand social problems from their direct experiences and strongly communicate ideas to improve Yokohama in their own words. (Summarized by ChatGPT-40)


