New Head Appointed to CityNet Yokohama Project Office (CYO)

On July 1, 2025, **Mr. Tadahiro Saegusa** succeeded Ms. Rumi Kurita as the head of CYO. Since joining the City of Yokohama in 1987, he has been in charge of international affairs and international cooperation projects for more than a decade. He served as Director General of International Affairs Bureau from April 2024 to March 2025. Subsequently, was appointed as Chairperson & CEO of Yokohama Association for International Communications and Exchanges (YOKE), a public interest incorporated foundation, in April 2025. Has been working on developing Yokohama as a multicultural coexistence city. Leveraging on his experience of more than 35 years in local government, he was appointed as the head of CYO and while at

CityNet, wishes to contribute to the further prosperity of member cities and organizations by deepening connections and collaborations.

I. Visit of delegation from Himachal Pradesh, India to Yokohama

On July 23, at the request of the All India Institute of Local Self-Government (AIILSG), a delegation of nine members, including the Minister of Urban Development Department of the Himachal Pradesh State Government, visited Yokohama City. The purpose of the visit was to learn about Yokohama's urban development concepts, the situation and challenges before and after the implementation of urban planning, and to identify issues for comprehensive action in Himachal Pradesh, as well as to study best practices from other cities. Himachal Pradesh is located in the Himalayan Mountains in northern India and faces disaster risks such as earthquakes, landslides, floods, and fires. As "disaster prevention strategy" was listed as a priority concern, the program focused on lectures and inspections related to disaster prevention and crisis management in Yokohama City.

In the lecture by the Yokohama City Crisis Management Office, the officials were introduced to the main points and structure of Yokohama City Disaster Prevention Plan, the damage caused by past earthquakes and the lessons learned from them, the "Yokohama City Earthquake Disaster Prevention Strategy" revised in March 2025 to strengthen earthquake disaster prevention measures, and the strengthening of local community disaster preparedness centers. The importance of promoting self-help and mutual assistance, such as efforts to improve the disaster prevention capabilities of citizens and local communities, and the promotion of disaster-resistant city development were emphasized. Participants actively asked questions about earthquake-resistant building regulations, stockpile management, training methods at local community disaster preparedness centers, and disaster prevention measures for each region. In the afternoon, the delegation visited the Yokohama Disaster Risk Reduction Learning Center and participated in an earthquake and fire experience tour. They enjoyed learning about how to protect themselves and evacuate in the event of a disaster by experiencing the shaking of a magnitude 7 earthquake, initial firefighting, and evacuation from smoke. The inspection team expressed strong interest in introducing similar facilities in their state to allow citizens to experience disaster preparedness in a more accessible manner.

Going forward, CYO will continue to collaborate with Yokohama City, disseminate information about Yokohama City's initiatives in response to the needs of CityNet members, and promote discussions on strategies to address urban issues in CityNet member cities.
