Projects to improve solid waste management systems in Cebu City, Philippines and Da Nang, Viet Nam were announced at the Annual Meeting of the Asian Development Bank (ADB), held in Yokohama from May 4 to 7.

Over 4,000 walk Yokohama for "Walk the World" charity
