Slovenia Ambassador visits Yokohama

H.E. Ms. Simona Leskovar, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Slovenia to Japan, visited Yokohama and met with Mayor Hayashi on June 16.



The Ambassador and Mayor discussed the connections between Slovenia and Yokohama, such as sports, as when Slovene athlete Alen Kobilica finished fourth in Yokohama's Paratriathlon Series event in May. They also exchanged views on Slovenia's women empowerment initiatives that have produced the smallest gender pay gap of all OECD member countries.



Taguig Mayor observes Yokohama water reclamation, treatment facilities

Mayor Lani Cayetano of Taguig City in the Metro Manila region of the Philippines visited Yokohama on June 7.

The Mayor, who had expressed interest in Yokohama's water reclamation systems, toured the Hokobu No. 2 Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Hokobu Sludge Treatment Center in Tsurumi Ward and received explanations of the facilities and wastewater treatment methods. During the tour, the mayor revealed her keen enthusiasm at the means employed to make an effective use of energy, such as the reuse of heat and water created through the treatment process.

19th Y-PORT Workshop held -ADB, other initiatives introduced

The 19th Yokohama Partnership of Resources and Technologies (Y-PORT) Workshop, with the theme of "Introducing New Initiatives for International Technical Cooperation" was held on May 30.

This workshop welcomed the representatives from the Asia Development Bank (ADB) to speak about the ADB's efforts to promote investment in infrastructure and its new inter-city support programs. Speakers also introduced the formation and purpose of the Yokohama Urban Solution Alliance (YUSA), comprised of volunteers from enterprises in Yokohama.

Attendees from various companies based in Yokohama, 69 in total, attended the conference, which also gave the attendees and speakers a platform to discuss issues and network.
