## Yokohama delegation attends International Conference in Tel Aviv-Yafo, Israel

The 8th Cities Summit was held in Tel Aviv-Yafo, Israel, with whom Yokohama shares a Proclamation of Exchange and Cooperation, and the International Affairs Bureau Director General Sekiyama and two staff members attended the conference to represent the city.



The Director General introduced Yokohama's initiatives in fields such as food education at the "Eating Healthy in an Urban Environment" workshop.



He also spoke to promote the city at the "Japan Innovation Night," a networking event arranged by organizations such as the Japanese Embassy, aimed at Japanese businesses entering Israel and related local officials. The delegation additionally visited the Tel Aviv-Yafo City Hall and Tel Aviv University to discuss potential academic and business collaboration going forward.



## Heads of Frankfurt, Yokohama international affairs offices discuss joint projects

International Affairs Bureau Director General Makoto Sekiyama visited Yokohama partner city Frankfurt, Germany, and met with the Director of the Frankfurt International Affairs Office.



They shared discussions focused primarily on the inter-city cultural, artistic, and youth exchange projects that are currently in development. They also reviewed their cities' collaboration on global warming countermeasures and reaffirmed their commitments to making steady advancements on these projects.
