

Local elementary school takes field trip to Yokohama International Center

The Yokohama Association for International Communications and Exchanges (YOKE) sponsored an event for elementary students to study the Yokohama International Center.

Students from Kosuzume Elementary School visited the Center on September 14, where the various international organizations discussed global issues, such as food shortages and environmental challenges, and their efforts to face them. The students also learned about initiatives to support multicultural community building for foreign residents living in Yokohama.



The program lasted through October 5, and over 1,000 students participated.



Additionally, a series of informational panels produced by the city were displayed to introduce the Center and other global organizations, how Yokohama cooperates with other cities abroad, and its dedication to promoting peace through international collaboration.
