"Yokohama Festival" held in sister city Mumbai, India

After becoming sister cities in 1965, the City of Yokohama and Mumbai, India, marked the 50th anniversary of friendly relations in 2015 as Yokohama established its Mumbai Representative Office. On December 7, it presented the first "Yokohama Festival" to promote the city's advantages, opportunities, and beauty.



Chief Representative Mr. Miyasaka and staff member Mr. Rawat received support from the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai, JETRO, JNTO, the Consulate General of Japan in Mumbai, and other related organizations.
