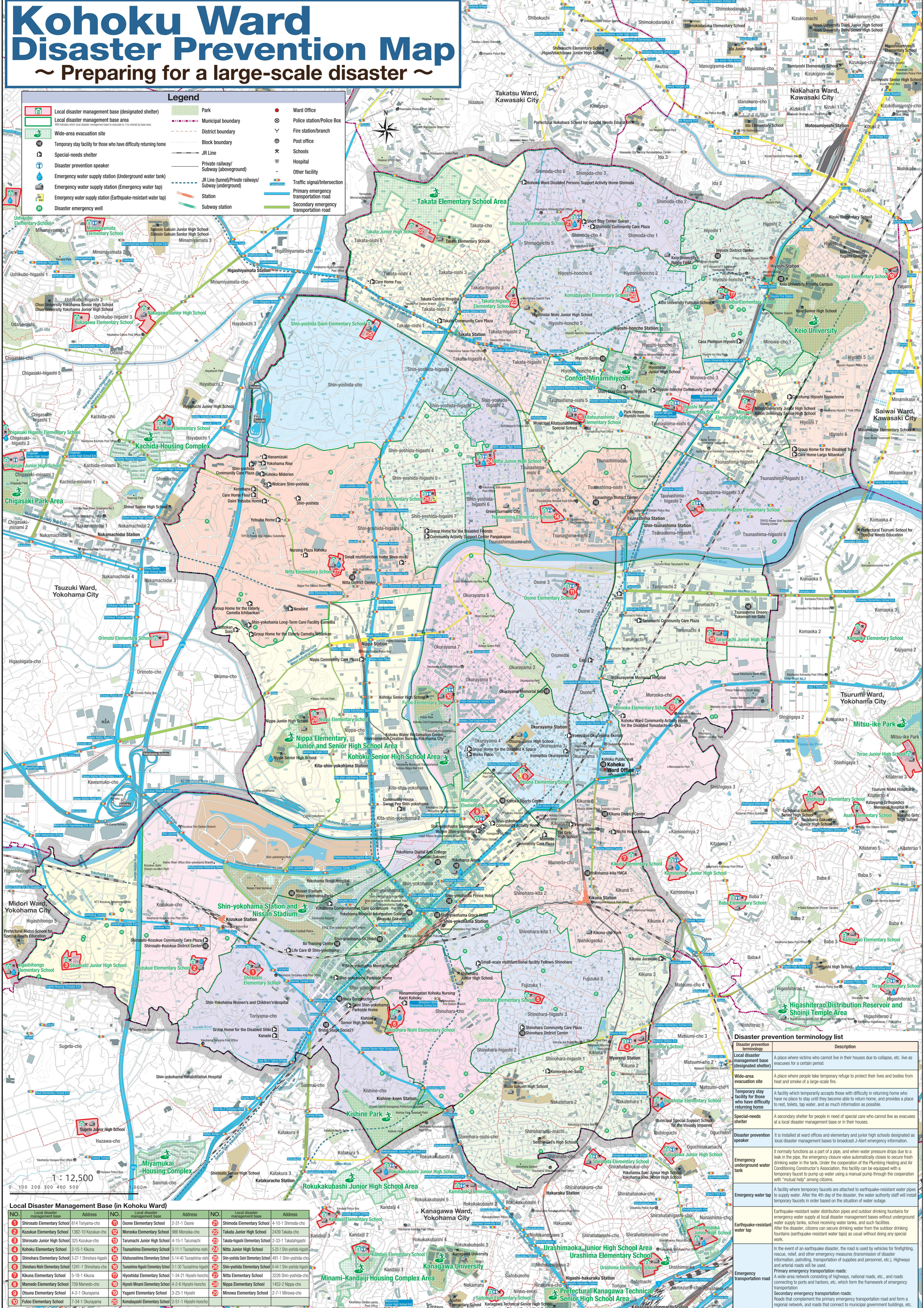


Kohoku Ward Disaster Prevention Map

Disaster prevention terminology list

Disaster prevention terminology	Description
Local disaster management base (designated shelter)	A place where victims who cannot live in their houses due to collapse, etc. live as evacuees for a certain period.
Wide-area evacuation site	A place where people take temporary refuge to protect their lives and bodies from heat and smoke of a large-scale fire.
Temporary stay facility for those who have difficulty returning home	A facility which temporarily accepts those with difficulty in returning home who have no place to stay until they become able to return home, and provides a place to rest, toilets, tap water, and as much information as possible.
Special-needs shelter	A secondary shelter for people in need of special care who cannot live as evacuees at a local disaster management base or in their houses.
Disaster prevention speaker	It is installed at ward offices and elementary and junior high schools designated as local disaster management bases to broadcast J-Alert emergency information.
Emergency underground water tank	It normally functions as a part of a pipe, and when water pressure drops due to a leak in the pipe, the emergency closure valve automatically closes to secure fresh drinking water in the tank. Under the cooperation of the Plumbing Heating and Air Conditioning Contractors Association, this facility can be equipped with a temporary faucet to pump up water using a manual pump through the cooperation with "mutual help" among citizens.
Emergency water tap	A facility where temporary faucets are attached to earthquake-resistant water pipes to supply water. After the 4th day of the disaster, the water authority staff will install temporary faucets in order based on the situation of water outage.
Earthquake-resistant water tap	Earthquake-resistant water distribution pipes and outdoor drinking fountains for emergency water supply at local disaster management bases without underground water supply tanks, school receiving water tanks, and such facilities. After the disaster, citizens can secure drinking water from the outdoor drinking fountains (earthquake-resistant water taps) as usual without doing any special work.
Emergency transportation road	In the event of an earthquake disaster, the road is used by vehicles for firefighting, rescue, relief, and other emergency measures (transportation of disaster information, patrolling, transportation of supplies and personnel, etc.). Highways and arterial roads will be used. Primary emergency transportation roads: Roads that complement the primary emergency transportation road and form a regional network, consisting of highways, national roads, etc., and roads connecting to ports and harbors, etc. which form the framework of emergency transportation. Secondary emergency transportation roads: Roads that complement the primary emergency transportation road and form a regional network, and roads that connect to municipal government buildings, etc.
