

Yokohama policy based on the declaration of a state of emergency

■ Public facilities

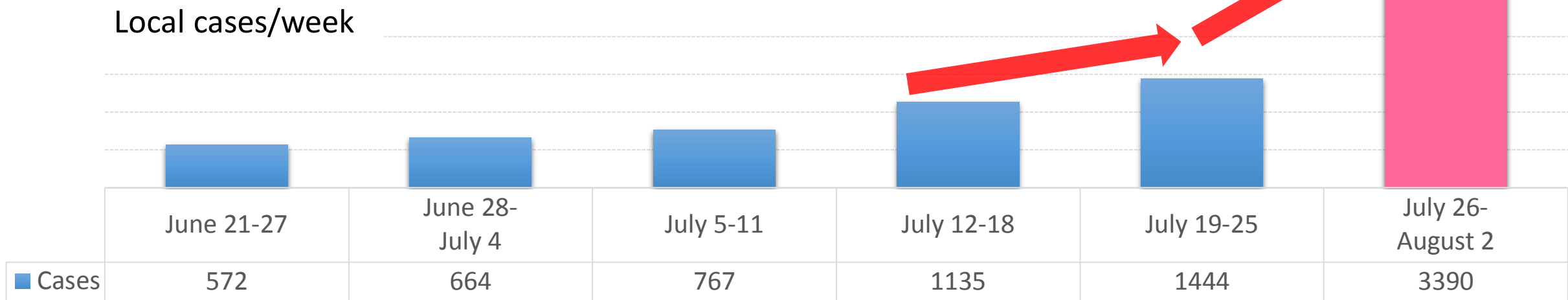
- To close by **8 p.m. (no change)**
Events: **to end by 9 p.m. (no change)**
- During state of emergency **no new reservations will be taken**

■ City-organized & co-organized events

- To **end by 9 p.m. (no change)**
- Attendance **capped at 5,000 or half capacity**

Infections in Yokohama

- **Surge in cases since mid-July, record 825 new cases as of August 2**
Week of 7/27 to 8/2 cases rose to 3,390,
2.4 times more previous week



- **Kanagawa Prefecture cases: nearly 44% delta variant virus (July 19-25)**

*Out of 3,726 new cases in the prefecture, 1,119 tested for variant strains, 496 delta strains detected. (Kanagawa Pref. HP)

Local health care system (As of 2 Aug 2021)

- Hospital beds in Yokohama for COVID-19 cases: 554
 - Current occupancy rate: **≈58%**

Patients with Severe symptoms: **38**

Surged last week since ≈15 cases in July

Moderate symptoms: **237**

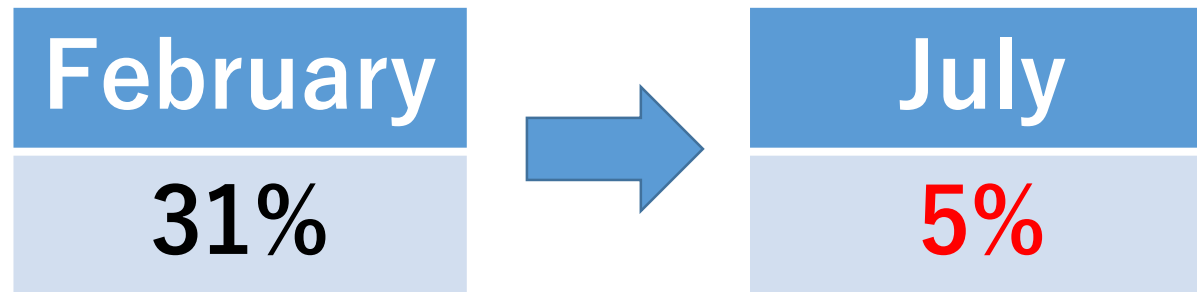
From ≈100 in early July, **now most cases so far**

- Additional 32 beds to be added for COVID-19 patients

Results of vaccinations

- **Vaccinations reducing infections in elderly resident population**

<Proportion of elderly residents among local COVID-19 cases>



- **Residents encouraged to get vaccinated at their workplaces or universities if available**

Request to residents

- **With summer vacations, more opportunities to travel, visit family, dine in groups, see loved ones, etc.**
