
YOKOHAMA GROWING TOGETHER WITH THE WORLD

A New Start as an **International Port City**

Japan enacts a law targeting Yokohama that brings great improvements to the port, transport network and industrial area to contribute to the country's effort toward cultural and economic development.



Establishment of an Office in Hamburg, Germany

Today, representative offices in Shanghai, Frankfurt and Mumbai conduct Yokohama's business overseas, encouraging tourism, foreign investment/expansion, and much more.

Opening of PACIFICO Yokohama

OBJECTIVE 2


Create new value by sharing ideas and opinions

5 International cooperation based on Yokohama's experience


Apply Yokohama's experience to actively contribute to expeditiously solving urban problems around the world in the context of concentrating urban populations.
