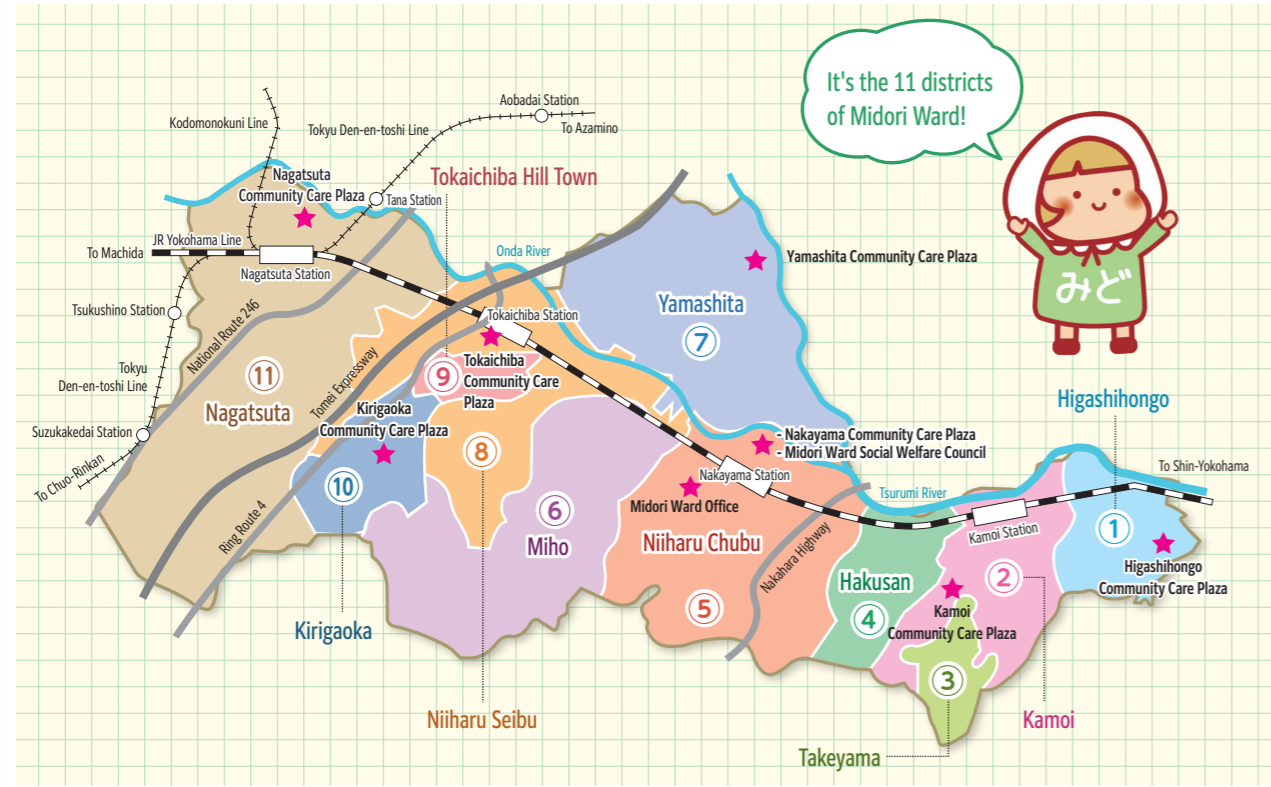

★ Midori Ward Community Welfare and Health Plan (Midorinowa Sasa e ai Plan) Basic Philosophy and Overall Objective

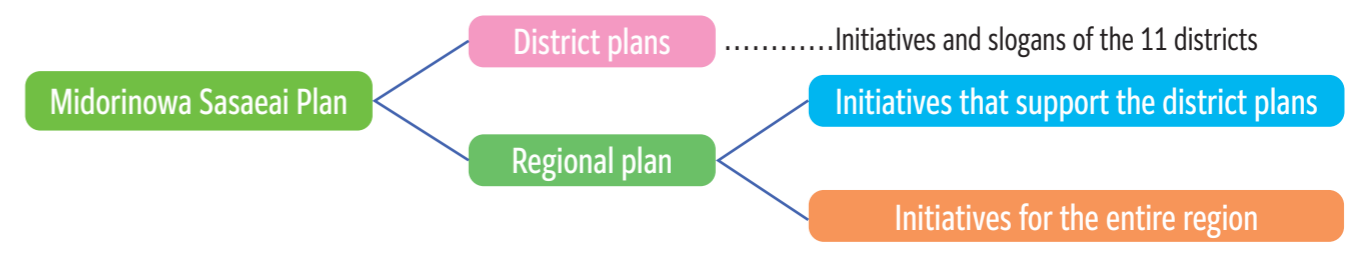
Initiatives are underway according to this plan with the basic philosophy and overall objective as follows.

★ Composition of the plan

We will coordinate and cooperate on the regional plan that affects all of Midori Ward and district plans led by smaller districts that aim to solve community challenges.



5th Plan 5 Points

The following 5 points are the focus of the 5th plan.

- (1) Strengthen community relationships and prevent social isolation.
- (2) Improve activities necessary to live in a community with peace of mind (livelihood support, etc.).
- (3) Implement initiatives that promote an understanding of diversity to create a foundation of mutual understanding and support across position and background.
- (4) Improve support so that everyone from children to the elderly can participate in health promotion and long-term care prevention initiatives.
- (5) Strengthen cooperation among regional bodies and related institutions and establish a broad network so that complex challenges can be addressed.

Important items

- A-1 Secure leaders and human resources for community activities and provide support for the activities
- A-2 Support the operations of community activity groups
- A-3 Create opportunities and spaces for community activities and exchange
- A-4 Devise ways to share information on community activities
- A-5 Improve community outreach systems
- A-6 Support community activities through coordination and cooperation with various bodies

Initiative details

- (1) Create opportunities for and coordinate community activities
- (2) Support exchange among registered volunteers
- (3) Share knowhow on community activities
- (1) Support establishing and operating community activity groups
- (2) Support volunteer activities for daily-life support run by community residents
- (3) Promote exchange among community activity groups and support a stronger network
- (4) Support the operation of neighborhood associations through initiatives that facilitate participation
- (1) Support the creation of opportunities and spaces for community activities
- (2) Find community resources for use in activities and exchange
- (3) Support the use of subsidies for creating spaces for activities and exchange
- (1) Help improve the promotion of community activities
- (2) Share information on community activities through promotional media
- (1) Establish awareness of outreach through daily community activities
- (2) Support the outreach activities of civil committee and children's committee members
- (3) Improve the outreach systems through cooperation among community businesses, etc.
- (4) Initiatives to support individuals who require help in case of disaster
- (1) Support for activities of social welfare corporations, etc., that contribute to communities
- (2) Share information on community activities through cooperation with businesses, etc.

B Initiatives for the entire region

- B-1 Promote policies that use data
- B-2 Create systems that facilitate problem solving
- B-3 Create a culture of mutual understanding among residents that transcends backgrounds
- B-4 Create a framework that ensures support at the local community level
- B-5 Develop policies through coordination and cooperation with various bodies

- (3) Comprehensive support for those that need it
- (4) Facilitate and expand health promotion programs for everyone from children to the elderly
- (5) Promote an environment more conducive to childrearing
- (1) Run programs in cooperation with businesses, universities, and NPOs
- (2) Improve services for livelihood support in cooperation with social welfare corporations, businesses, and other bodies
- (3) Initiatives that support the operation of welfare evacuation shelters in coordination with social welfare corporation facilities
