



- Persons with a cough or phlegm. Persons who have a fever or chest pains.
- Persons who have chest X-rays in physical examinations at their company or school.
- Persons who have had a chest X-ray exam in the last 3 months.

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What kind of disease is tuberculosis?

- ▶ Tuberculosis is a disease that causes inflammation of the lungs and other organs due to bacteria (*Mycobacterium tuberculosis*).



Is tuberculosis infectious?


- ▶ Yes, it can be spread through coughing and sneezing.



The tuberculosis bacteria are sprayed into the air along with droplets from coughing and sneezing. If people nearby inhale these bacteria in the air, they can catch tuberculosis.

Can tuberculosis be cured?

- ▶ Yes, it can be cured with medicine.



Tuberculosis patients take multiple medications daily for anywhere from 6 months to 9 months or more. They must take these medicines until the prescribed day even if the symptoms disappear. If they stop before this day, their tuberculosis will not be cured.
