Town Blessed with Nature



Sakae-ku is located in one corner of the city's largest green belt (surrounding Mt. Enkaizan). It is encompassed by abundant nature, including the Yokohama Nature Sanctuary and five Citizens' Forests, and a hiking course that leads through to Tenen at Kamakura via scenic routes and natural woodlands is

available in the southeastern part of the ward. It is possible to view flowers and wild birds throughout all four seasons, and stunning views of Mt. Fuji are available from many areas on sunny winter days. Delicious fresh vegetables are grown in Taya, Nagaodai and other areas in the western part of the ward; some of which are shipped under the name of "Kamakura vegetables". An area blessed with a green and very pleasant natural environment while remaining part of the large metropolis of Yokohama: That's Sakae-ku.



The Calming Effects of a River

The Itachi River, which flows from east to west through the center of Sakae-ku, is a symbolic river for the ward. The upper reaches of the river contain many waterside areas with abundant nature, and in summer it is possible to see children playing around the banks of the river and catching crayfish, etc. A promenade alongside the river is available at the lower reaches, which is very popular with local residents as they enjoy walking and birdwatching, all of which helps Sakae-ku

support long and healthy live spans. If you are lucky, you may catch a glimpse of a kingfisher; the flying blue gem of water-land areas.

Spending all four seasons with the babbling brook of the Itachi River: That's Sakae-ku.







A Safe and Secure Community

Sakae-ku is the only administrative ward in all of Japan to have international certification as a Safe Community. A "Safe Community" is a region that is committed to safety in everyday life and strives to prevent accidents by analyzing data to identify the cause of past injuries and



accidents. Internationally recognized activities to prevent accidents and injury are bolstered by the ward's strong local community.

Sakae-ku is also the location of Japan's first ever day care center for children with severe mental and physical abilities, named Tomo, and various events are held providing opportunities for interaction with the people of the community.

Glittering Technology and Bonds of Friendship



Sakae-ku.


Connecting and Interacting with Other Towns



Redevelopment of the No.2 Zone Urbanization Project in North Ofuna

Redevelopment projects are moving forward in the area surrounding the North Exit (Kasama Exit) of Ofuna Station, which acts as the gateway to Sakae-ku. The area is now fully equipped with apartment buildings and commercial facilities.

The bus terminal and bicycle parking area are scheduled for future renewal.

Town Planning Around Hongodai Station

Various public facilities have been constructed in the vicinity of JR Hongodai Station, which could be said to represent the nerve center of Sakae-ku with its ginkgo trees and cherry-blossoms lining the roads. The future construction of a multi-purpose public complex and apartments along the Itachi River will create additional public spaces, which will ensure that the charm of Sakae-ku's central area is enhanced even further.

Yokohama Ring Expressway Southern Line, Yokohama Shonan Road, Kamigo-Kuden Line

Access into the area will become even more convenient when the Kamigo-Kuden Line, which will connect Sakae-ku districts of Kamigo and Kuden with the Yokohama Ring Expressway Southern Line and Yokohama Shonan Road, both of which are southern Yokohama Ring Expressway providing access to certain parts of the Metropolitan Inter-City Expressway, is
